

May Quarterly Meeting Minutes Roswell-Alpharetta Public Safety Training Center May 24, 2006

I. Welcome: Chief Ed Williams, Roswell Police Department

Chief Williams welcomed the Task Force to Roswell and expressed his support for TIME and the incident management initiatives being achieved by the organization. He also discussed the success of the Roswell local open roads policy.

II. Introductions and Background: Gary Millsaps, TIME President

There were a few new members in attendance at the Quarterly Meeting. Mr. Millsaps welcomed the new faces, briefly discussed the benefits and goals of the TIME Task Force, and initiated self-introductions among the group.

Goals of TIME

- Increase public awareness of regional incident management.
- Develop/deliver common training for incident responders.
- Coordinate, communicate, and cooperate between different agencies in the region.

Mission of TIME

Develop and sustain a region-wide incident management program to facilitate the safest and fastest roadway clearance, lessening the impact on emergency responders and the motoring public.

Purpose of TIME

- To continue the dialogue on ways to improve inter-agency coordination and cooperation.
- To create an opportunity for multi-agency training this promotes teamwork.
- To serve as a platform for participants to develop common operational strategies and a better understanding of other agencies' roles and responsibilities.

III. NaviGAtor Web Update and Demonstration: James Gordon, Georgia DOT

NaviGAtor Web is a web service framework created as an effective means to transfer transportation data among agencies with different legacy systems. The concepts encompassed by the NaviGAtor Web

Program will enable GDOT to realize the original vision for "NaviGAtor" under an accelerated schedule and at significantly lower costs than previously possible. The service allows for universal NaviGAtor participation to any transportation stakeholder or agency with access to the internet. The site provides access to NaviGAtor software functionality through an Application Service hosted by GDOT via a userid and password. Users will have the benefit of NaviGAtor, such as viewing cameras, reporting incidents, changing signs, creating messages and sharing information, without having to maintain any hardware or software. Internet access to NaviGAtor functionality is now available for agencies outside of GDOT by the application of internet based technologies.

IV. Specialized Collision Reconstruction Teams (SCRT): Lieutenant Peterman, Georgia State Patrol

The SCRT originated in 1997 to investigate fatal crashes thoroughly by specially trained investigators and to properly document evidence in collisions to be used in court for successful prosecution of violators. As a result statistics are compiled in an effort to attempt to avoid future occurrences of similar collisions thus saving lives.

The SCRT complete numerous levels of training including the following:

- All levels of crash reconstruction currently taught at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center (GPSTC),
- Commercial Vehicle Reconstruction
- Air Brake Inspection and Analysis
- Motorcycle Collision Reconstruction
- Pedestrian / Bicycle Reconstruction
- Photography
- Crime Scene Evidence Collection
- Forensic Mapping and Collision Diagramming
- Applied Physics
- Vehicular Homicide Prosecution
- Stress Management
- Tire Damage Analysis

Currently there are 33 members on the SCRT located in five offices statewide. Members get involved when there is a fatality or anytime a state vehicle is involved in a fatal crash. SRCT uses both 35 mm and digital photography in crash scene investigations. Forensic mapping is also used to measure crash scenes and produce scale diagrams.

SCRT response trucks are outfitted with the following equipment:

- 7.5 kw Diesel Generator
- Permanent and Free Standing Portable Lights
- Air Compressor
- Air Brake Test Equipment

- Extensive Set of Tools
- 10,000 lb. Winch
- Measuring Equipment
- Sokkia Total Station (Forensic Mapping Device)
- Standard Fiberglass and Steel Tapes
- Roller Wheel
- Precision Calipers
- Digital Video Equipment
- Vericom VC-3000 Accelerometer
- Crash Data Retrieval System (CDR)
- Laptop Computers
- 35 mm Cameras
- Recording Devices

In addition, SCRT assist with collision investigations for local manipulates and sheriff's departments and training.

Question 1: How many SCRT members are present at an accident investigation?

Answer 1: Two members are available for each region, one on-call person and one alternate or back-up. There are no problems with state troopers collecting pictures and data to conduct timely responses.

Question 2: How much did the bomb scare cost in dollars?

Answer 2: The answer is unknown, but speculated to be several thousand dollars.

V. New Traffic Incident Management Motorcycle Unit: Soffie Thigpen, Georgia State Patrol

With the support of the Governor, a pilot program will place ten GSP motorcycle units in Metro Atlanta for the next five years. These units will be available on any interstate within the perimeter to aid in enforcement of aggressive drivers, moving fender-bender accidents off the interstate quickly, special events, details and escorts.

Motorcycle units were in place several years ago (1970's) but plenty of officers were injured. Injuries are the number one concern with this problem; however, a career in law enforcement is a risk regardless. The key to success of this program with minimal injuries will be extensive training. In addition to initial training, officers will be required to complete one day of mandatory training per month.

Bill 1209 will be signed on July 1st to finance this program. All fines from the motorcycle units will return to the unit with small fees being distributed to the city for court costs. The cost to purchase the motorcycles is \$277K.

Lieutenant Thigpen is the first woman Lieutenant in GSP and she will be the head of this motorcycle unity. The Unit is excited to make a difference on congestion in the region.

Questions resulted in the following points:

• The unit would like to train with all agencies, especially HERO's.

- The hours of operation will be mostly daytime because of safety precautions.
- Two motorcycle units can take the place of six squad cars by using the "leap frog" effect of blocking more vehicles.
- The unit will operate 12 month of the year with the exception of 17 days that riders will be limited due to weather constraints.

VI. After Incident Review (AIR) Presentation: Battalion Chief Jack Butler, Fulton County Fire Department

Incident Date: March 6, 2006

Incident Location: I-285 Westbound between Glenridge Drive & Roswell Road

Responders: Fulton County PD, Fulton County Fire, Marietta Wrecker Service, HERO Units,

DOT District Maintenance, Fulton County Medical Examiner

On March 6 at approximately 1255 hours, a motorist traveling westbound on I-285 just west of the Glenridge Road access ramp discovered a ladder lying just ahead of his car. He stopped in the travel lane. A tractor-trailer (#1) stopped behind the car. A second car, a Mazda sedan, stopped behind tractor-trailer #1. A second tractor-trailer (#2) saw the stopped vehicles and slammed on his brakes. Despite leaving at least 100 feet of tire rubber on the interstate, tractor-trailer #2 slammed into the Mazda, effectively folding it up from the rear like a bedroll. The front wheels came to rest on top of the driver, crushing him along with the rest of the Mazda. The four center lanes (of 6 total lanes) were blocked by the accident.
